



E. CLIFTON DANIEL JR. '33

E Clifton Daniel Jr. '33 died February 21, 2000, at the age of 87. While a student at the University of North Carolina, Clifton served as editor of the campus literary magazine and vice president of the student body.

In 1956, Clifton married Margaret Truman, the daughter and only child of former President Harry S. Truman and his wife, Bess. The Daniels raised four sons.

During his long career in the newspaper business, Clifton earned respect as a reporter, political writer, columnist, war correspondent and editor. He served as managing editor of *The New York Times* from 1964-69. Later, as head of *The Times* 'Washington bureau, he wrote analytical articles and oversaw the coverage of President Richard M. Nixon's resignation and the outset of Gerald R. Ford's presidency.

Clifton is survived by his wife, Margaret; four sons, Clifton, William, Harrison and Thomas; and five grandchildren.
