PHI DELT LAUNCHES EFFORT TO SUPPORT THE COLLEGE OF ARTS AND SCIENCES AND TO HONOR DR. REET

Join us on October 13 to kick off the fundraising efforts!

North Carolina Beta is embarking on an effort to endow a distinguished professorship in the College of Arts and Sciences. With the enthusiastic support of dean Risa Palm and a lead gift of \$100,000 from Garnett A. Smith '69 of Naples, Florida, Phi Delt alumni are challenged to raise an additional \$566,000 in private gifts in order to claim the \$334,000 matching gift from the State of North Carolina Distinguished Professors Endowment Trust Fund.

In honor of a beloved member of N.C. Beta, the professorship will bear the name of Matthew Mason. This will accomplish the dual goals of supporting Carolina faculty at the highest level and recognizing "Dr. Reet," who has made an extraordinary personal contribution to our chapter.

For those of us who plan to participate in the university's \$1.5 billion Carolina First Campaign, a gift to the Phi Delta Theta/Matthew Mason Distinguished Professorship will address a principal campaign priority and count toward this monumental goal. I encourage you to allocate a substantial portion of your Carolina First pledge to the Phi Delta Theta/Matthew Mason Distinguished Professorship in the College of Arts and Sciences.

Endowed professorships help to recruit, retain and support outstanding scholars/teachers of international reputation. A recent benchmark survey of five top public and private research universities with which UNC compares itself, shows that the average salary of a full professor in the College of Arts and Sciences at Carolina lags behind by more than \$14,000 per year. Private funds are essential to close this gap and make it possible for Carolina to compete for outstanding faculty.

This is the first in a series of articles about facility management lacksquare at the house throughout the year. Bob Page and I thought many of you might be interested in what's being done to assure that the house stays in tip-top shape, and in information on the food and environmental services offered during the school year. Also included is an overview of the comprehensive maintenance program that has been in place for the last three semesters.

Before the house reopened in August '98, I discussed with Steve Bell '67, Bob Page '52 and other board members the need for a professional foodservice management company during the school year. Since that time, a foodservice contract has been in place, with John Jenkins as our chef. He has spoiled the guys with great food and service! In addition, his very nice wife, Jill, takes care of keeping the house clean during the week and special weekends, and helps John with

catering events on football weekends and at other times. (She is likewise a good cook!)

They are a great couple (see picture) and a wonderful asset to the Phi Delt house. If you have not met them, please introduce yourself the next time you are there. For the past two summers (and during Christmas break), they have made repairs, painted, waxed floors, washed windows and blinds, disposed of abandoned room carpets and furniture, cut the grass, pruned the shrubs, spread mulch and made sure the house looked as good as when it

reopened in August '98.

You can be certain that as long as these programs continue, you are receiving a good return on your contributions to the 1998 renovation project.

The house preventive maintenance program assures that all safety equipment (i.e., fire alarms, sprinkler systems, kitchen-hood fire-extinguishing system) are inspected every six months by a

> qualified service company. In addition, written inspections are conducted by me every week school is in session, and any problems discovered are repaired immediately (i.e., replacing light bulbs, reinforcing closet clothes bars, tightening loose door locks or dead bolts, etc.) or a vendor is called in to make repairs beyond my capability. My goal again is to make sure that the house remains in good condition, hopefully resulting in having no major repairs throughout the year.

Finally, to forge a strong communication link with the undergraduates, I meet with president Durant Bell every Friday to discuss all issues relating to food, housekeeping, maintenance and other topics as needed. I enjoy working with Durant (as well as with other brothers), as he sets a perfect example for positive and effective leadership.


