We are extremely fortunate to have an outstanding group of young men as undergraduates in our Chapter. We have maintained a consistent group of 65-70 members which makes for a solid financial picture. Our taxes, insurance, utilities and food expenses all continue to rise each year which makes it imperative for us to have at



least 60 members for the Chapter to meet its obligations. We ended the 2006-2007 school year with a surplus of \$40,000 which we put into our reserve account bringing the balance to \$80,750.00. We very much need to grow that account to handle future capital expenditures without having to call on our generous alumni.

I am pleased to report that our young men now stand 6th out of 22 fraternities in their cumulative chapter grade point average. Recently the members raised over \$250,000 for the Millennium Project. Andrew Woodin and Worth Morgan presented the donation at half-time of the UNC vs. Duke basketball. We have athletes on the football team and seven members of our house are on the lacrosse team currently ranked 5th in the nation.

We truly enjoy getting the parents involved in our parent's weekend each fall. This year it will be November 8, 2008 when the Tar Heels host the GA Tech Yellow Jackets so reserve the weekend and join us. We are very appreciative of the efforts of Beth Duckett and Wanda Mackie who organized a terrific weekend of activities last year including a pre-game brunch and a wonderful dinner at the Carolina Inn. This tradition was started in 1999 by **Steven D. Bell '67** and has grown to be an anticipated event for parents, brothers, siblings and dates to socialize and get to know each other better.

Phi Delt is One of Top Two on Campus, Makes Largest Fraternity Gift in UNC History, Brings Academics Up to 6th Place

Oversight and Hard Work of the Beta Foundation and the Jenkins Make the Phi Delt House Undeniably the Best on Campus

It is an exciting time when brothers start putting away their winter gear and start breaking out shorts and t-shirts once more. Everyone knows Chapel Hill is a special place to be during the spring time, and this year will be no different. We are all very fortunate to have Phi Delt in such a strong and stable position, and I promise this will continue to be the case for years to come.

Phi Delt had a great fall semester taking in 14 new brothers, bringing the total number of active brothers to 66. This ranks us in the top two fraternities on campus, and we have consistently maintained a much higher number than the campus average of 45 brothers. The graduating class is one of the largest in Phi Delt history (23), and this makes this next year's class incredibly important. We are already working on next year's recruitment process. The sophomore rush chairs for this year are Michael Carbone, David Paschal, Will Teddy and Brent Blonkvist. They will have the incredible benefit of having junior Myles Wynn on their team, who is an experienced rush organizer and a great leader. We are officially kicking off the rush process with a spring event in Chapel Hill on the weekend of April 11th. Phi Delt is extremely proud of its recent philanthropic achievements. With

100% participation from the brothers and the incredible commitment from several parents, Phi Delt has raised \$250,000 for the Millennium Village Project. This is the largest gift ever given by a fraternity or sorority in UNC history, and it exemplifies the hard work and dedication of both the active members and their families. MVP is a United Nations sponsored project, and it aims at eliminating poverty in Africa by building sustainable infrastructures in impoverished villages. Phi Delt was lucky enough to present the \$250,000 check at halftime of this year's UNC vs. Duke basketball game. The former philanthropic chair, Andrew Woodin, current chair Worth Morgan, and Ed Ross deserve a tremendous amount of credit for making this campaign the largest and most special event in Phi Delt history.

The brothers have also improved their academic standing from last semester. Among the 22 fraternities on campus, Phi Delt has gone from the 17^{th} position in years past to currently being 6^{th} on campus with a GPA of 3.023.

There will be a new drive to seek out alumni who will come to Chapel Hill and talk with the brothers about what Phi Delt meant to them, the importance of leadership, and any other advice that would be helpful. Additionally, Phi Delt receives a lot of support from the alumni through the Beta Foundation, which works to maintain the house and keep the fraternity systems in order. Thank you alumni for your commitment to the Phi Delt house, your efforts are critical to keeping this organization in such fine shape.

Because of the Beta Foundation's oversight and John and Jill Jenkins' hard work, the Phi Delt house is undeniably the best on campus. There have been several projects completed and others planned for the summer. First, the dining room looks great with new wall paneling and a new lounge adjacent to the dining area. The second floor has been retiled and the bathroom has been completely renovated. This summer the same will be done for the third floor, and it will make the brothers' living space a lot better. Finally, through a gift from the parents' council and contributions made by 100% of the active members, Phi Delt has a new 60" HDTV in the Bob Page lounge. The food service and day-to-day maintenance is still handled by John and Jill, who are currently in their ninth year at the Phi Delt house.

Phi Delt is also very proud to have eight varsity lettermen as active brothers. We currently have 7 lacrosse players: Fletcher Gregory and Mike Munnelly are both senior captains, and they are flanked by sophomores Joe Howard, Michael Burns, Michael Jarvis and face off standout Shane Walterhoefer. Mark Paschal will be returning to the football team in the fall for his senior year, and hopefully he will garner even more ACC defensive player of the week awards.
