

Honoring Our Past, Securing Our Future

The North Carolina Beta Board has approved an exciting new plan to renovate parts of the Fraternity House, including sections of the first



We have mailed out more than eleven hundred folders with pledge cards to all Phi Delt alumni. We want to thank all of the gracious alumni who have helped make this project possible.

The idea for renovation was prompted by our active brothers of the house to improve the overall quality and appearance of the home. The plan includes multiple changes; details are listed below.

The foyer will be opened up by removing much of the back wall, allowing better flow from the party room. It will also create a unique view of the stairway that leads down to the game room.

The under-utilized space in the basement will be transformed into a fully-equipped pool room, providing an environment the house currently lacks.

The party room will gain approximately thirty percent more square footage, as the current bar room will be replaced with a new sitting area. The new two-counter bar will replace the unused office space (the former mother room) to serve both the foyer and the party room.

Presently, the brothers do not have a suitable area that is large enough for Chapter meetings or major social events. This dynamic space will allow for larger happenings.

Several technical improvements will increase the overall functionality of the house, which will include: increased efficiency with a new HVAC system, a walk-in refrigerator/freezer, an updated first-floor bathroom, and a new laundry area for the 20-plus sophomores who live in the house annually.

UPDATES FROM THE UNDERGRADUATE PRESIDENT

In my short tenure as President of the North Carolina Beta Chapter of Phi Delta Theta, I have quickly come to understand the great importance this fraternity has at UNC.

Seven other actives and I have been working with Steven Bell '67, Chairman of Phi Delta Theta Capital Campaign Committee on fundraising projects. I have researched the history of the chapter regarding its philanthropy, awards from National, campus involvement and scholastic achievements. What I've learned has shown me what an outstanding fraternity Phi Delta is.

There are currently 90 members in our chapter who are from all corners of the United States. All of the undergraduate brothers are involved

in a wide range of campus activities, including sports teams, student government and philanthropic efforts. There are members on UNC's varsity baseball, tennis, golf, wrestling and lacrosse teams, in addition to the junior varsity basketball team.

Our undergrads maintain consistently high GPAs. Currently, we have five Morehead-Cain Scholars, three Robertson Scholars and a Truman Scholar.

Community service is another cornerstone of our fraternity. Phi Delta, in partnership with Pi Beta Phi, hosts the campus-wide Eve Carson Memorial 5K. The proceeds go to scholarship


