Phi Deltas Mourn the Passing of Dr. J. Allen Whitaker '28, our Oldest Member and Dear Friend

His Zest for Life and Giving Nature Sets an Example for Us All

On Dec. 19, 2006, Nash County, North Carolina, our Phi Delta Theta nation lost a great friend. **Dr. J. Allen Whitaker '28**, who had just turned 101 years old and was our chapter's oldest living member, perhaps the oldest of all living Phi Deltas, left a wonderful legacy we can all be proud of.

When I moved to Rocky Mount in 1984, I was contacted and greeted by many Phis in the area, but my association and friendship with Dr. Whitaker had a special impact on me. In true Phi Delt tradition, Dr. Whitaker was involved in numerous organizations and endeavors that benefited his community. What stands out the most for me was Dr. Whitaker's love and passion for our Phi Delt house and chapter in Chapel Hill. Right up until the end of his life, he never ceased asking me about the status of the Phi Delt Chapter. He called me around his 90th birthday and said he had recently visited the Phi Delt House, either before or after a football game, and he instructed me to get over to Chapel Hill as soon as possible and assist with "cleaning up the place."

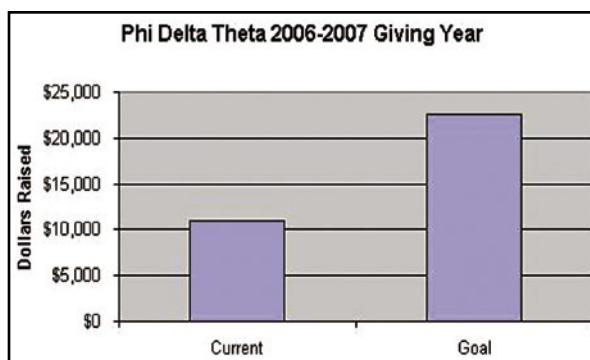
Dr. Whitaker was a true southern gentleman. He was a wonderful storyteller, the life of a party, had a gleam in his eye for the ladies and always had impeccable manners...all of the traits which I hope continue to be taught and stressed at the PDT hut. I am honored to have known him and I hope we can all do our part in carrying on

the traditions he helped establish. He never lost sight of his college fraternity and the friendships and associations that were initiated and nurtured in Chapel Hill. This is the legacy he leaves for all of us.

Dr. Whitaker is survived by his daughter, Sybil Haskins Booth, and her husband, Pete, of Wrightsville Beach; his son, **J. Allen Whitaker III '64**, and his wife, Pam, of Wilson; and his son, **George G. Whitaker '66**, and his wife, Beezie, of Rocky Mount. Most of you know that both Allen and George are also Phis from Chapel Hill and both are carrying on the legacy established by their father.

Undergraduates See Huge Results in Fundraising Efforts and Chapter Recruitment

Brothers raised over \$200,000 for the Millenium Village Project, Leading UNC in Fundraising

As my term as president of Phi Delt approaches the half way point, I have begun to think about the ways in which Phi Delta Theta has grown over the past semester and about the ways in which we look forward to improving in the future. As Robert mentioned in the most recent letter, Phi Delt received Community Service Citations, Improvement Citations, and Recruitment Awards for the third year in a row. Also, we passed all five safety inspections with a perfect score.

Late this fall, some Phi Delt members got involved with the Millenium Village Project (MVP), a mission to eradicate extreme poverty throughout the world, starting in Africa. The project was founded by renowned economist, Dr. Jeffrey Sachs. The University of North Carolina – Chapel Hill is one of the first universities in the world to involve itself with MVP, and Phi Delt is already the leading fundraiser at UNC. The brothers of Phi Delt have raised over \$200,000 in the past couple months, mostly through generous alumni and family donations. An anonymous donor has agreed to match up to \$750,000 for the project, and Phi Delt is truly blazing a unique and unprecedented trail with its efforts to date. Having said that, we appreciate any

further support that you can give us, whether it is money for the project or support in developing a trademark philanthropy event.

We did not have spring rush this year because our fall pledge class was very strong. Phi Delt is now up to 67 brothers and 2 affiliates, Robert Hennessy (Atlanta) and Mike Munnely (Long Island). Our rush chairs, Myles Wynn (Charlotte), Addison Montague (Charlotte), and John Lambert (Winston-Salem) did a fantastic job this past fall, and we recently elected rush chairs for next year, Sam French, (Winston-Salem), Chris Williams (Burlington, NC) and Travis Cooke (Greensboro, NC). As always, we maintain a wide variety of young men from all over the United States. We still have brothers from Long Island, NY, Denver, CO, Jacksonville, FL, but also welcomed more from Winston-Salem, Wilmington, Charlotte, Houston (TX) and Richmond. John Choate (Charlotte), and Mark Paschal (Charlotte) are all returning players to this year's football team, joined by freshmen kicker John Kerns (Houston), John Banks Powell (Burlington) and Scott Gunn (Burlington). Fletcher Gregory is joined on the lacrosse team with freshmen Tommy D'Allesandre (Charlotte), Michael Jarvis (Richmond), and Joe Howard

(Durham), sophomore Shane Walterhoeffer (Baltimore), and Mike Munnely (Long Island). In addition to our Division I athletes, the brothers of Phi Delt won the fraternity intramural basketball championship this past week.

We would like to thank Bob Page and John Cornick for their continued support throughout the year. We rely on the condition of our house as a major deciding factor to future rushees, and the Phi Delt house is, without a doubt, a premier facility on campus. The wonderful condition of the house can be attributed to the continued hard work that John and Jill Jenkins provide for us in cooking, cleaning, and making repairs that occur through daily use of the house.

We would like to thank all of you for continual support. Without your interest and contributions, we would never be in the place we are today. Rally 'Round the House, Boys! Alumni Support is Critical to Maintain Phi Delt's Competitive Edge on Campus

With Fewer Rushees, Alumni Support is Needed to Keep Fraternities a Strong Presence at UNC

The UNC Phi Delt's and the Beta Foundation are extremely grateful for our alumni's support. The Greek system at UNC and other colleges is struggling to remain an integral part of the college experience. This past fall, only 475 men participated in fraternity rush. With 22 fraternities on campus that have an average chapter size of 45 men, competition is fierce between the Phi Gams, DKEs, Betas and Phi Delt's for the top candidates. The chapter and the Beta Foundation work to gain any competitive advantage we can. We have done well in past years and were able to attract 15 to 20 new members each year, keeping our total membership around 70 members.

Your monetary support helps with unexpected maintenance items, football game day brunches for alumni and rush brochures for potential members. We also need your help identifying potential
