A Letter from the Chapter President

Brothers,



I am happy to report that things at the Beta Chapter are going well. This past fall, we initiated 26 new members and one new affiliate, representing 7 different states and including 3 Robertson scholars and a varsity athlete (lacrosse). This brings the total membership of the NC Beta Chapter to 95 active brothers, one of the highest numbers in recent history, demonstrating our success in recruiting. We have brothers from all across the US (and Scotland). Among our actives are also 3 Morehead Scholars. We have been very successful academically, as we have maintained an average among the top fraternities on campus. We finished the fall semester with a 3.31 average, an outstanding number that is well above the all-fraternity average and the university all-men's average.

We believe that strong academics is an important foundation for our chapter and we will continue to place an emphasis on being among the best academically.

Our brothers are active across campus in a number of ways including: Varsity, club and intramural athletic teams across a number of sports, various community service organizations like GoMeals, which collects leftover meals from Greek houses and gives them to the homeless, clubs and organizations at the business school like the Kenan-Flagler Foundation Real Estate Fund, community fundraisers like the Mixed Concrete art show, which raised \$16,000 for Habitat for Humanity, and many more. These are just a few examples of the ways our brothers stay active and involved in the UNC community. One brother, Robert Degolian '19, is a member of the UNC Clef Hangers, who hosted their sold out $40^{\rm th}$ anniversary concert this spring. We are proud of our involvement on campus and will continue to be leaders in the community.

We have had success philanthropically, co-hosting the 10th annual Eve Carson Memorial 5K with Pi Beta Phi in the fall, which raised over \$100,000, including in-kind donations, for the Eve Carson Scholarship Fund, the Literacy Fund, and CEO4Teens, which was founded by NC Beta alumnus Kenny Haisfield '12. We partnered with Chi Omega to host our inaugural Casino Night, benefitting our local branch of Habitat for Humanity. We also hosted our 7th annual Cookout to Knockout ALS with Kappa Delta at the Phi Delt House. These events make us one of the strongest chapters on campus philanthropically.

We have had a tremendous year and we will continue our success into the future. We will continue to carry on the legacy of Phi Delt as the best fraternity on campus, and we will not be complacent but strive for improvement. Whenever you're in Chapel Hill, stop by the house, we look forward to seeing you. Have a great 2018 and as always, go Heels!


Excelling Academically
